We have been informed that an outbreak of head lice is currently circulating the school and we are asking that you watch for signs that your child may be infested. There are several signs and symptoms to look for, these include:

- Tiny little white specks stuck to the hair usually near the scalp.
- Black dust on the pillow and shirt collar (lice faeces).
- Scalp itch may occur but often the condition has no symptoms.
- Presence of actual lice on the scalp.

Lice may be acquired by direct contact with an infested person's hair or personal belongings. Children appear to be affected more often because of close contact at school and their tendency to share hats, brushes and combs. Preparations are available from the chemist/IGA if you require treatment.
