I will still be the Relieving Principal next term and I look forward to working with everyone again.

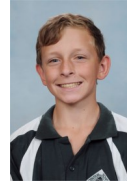
To all students I wish you a good break and hopefully you will come back refreshed and enthusiastic in the new term.

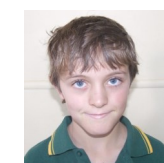
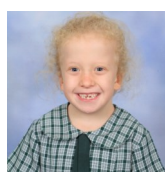
